

A PROCLAMATION

BY THE GOVERNOR.

TO THE PEOPLE OF NEW MEXICO:

WHEREAS, the public resolution of congress entitled "Joint Resolution to admit the territories of New Mexico and Arizona as states into the Union upon an equal footing with the original states," which was approved August 21, 1911, required that the electors of New Mexico should vote upon a proposed amendment to their state constitution, which was set forth at length in said resolution of congress, as a condition precedent to the admission of said state, and that they should so vote at the same time at the first general state election as provided for in the said constitution should be held, which said first general state election was held on the seventh day of November, 1911, and the returns of said election upon this amendment having been made and canvassed, as in section five of said resolution of congress provided, and the result thereof having been certified by the canvassing board therein provided for, to me as Governor of the Territory of New Mexico, together with a statement of the votes cast, upon the question of the ratification or rejection of said amendment:

NOW THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM J. MILLS, Governor of the Territory of New Mexico, in the discharge of the duty imposed on me by section five of said resolution of congress, do hereby proclaim that the result of said election upon said amendment as certified to me by said canvassing board, is that there were 34,897 votes cast in favor of said amendment, and 22,831 votes cast against said amendment, and that therefore the said amendment to Article XIX of the proposed constitution of the state of New Mexico, which is as follows, to-wit:

"Article XIX.

"Amendment.

"Section 1. Any amendment or amendments to this constitution may be proposed in either house of the legislature at any regular session thereof; and if a majority of all the members elected to each of the two houses voting separately shall vote in favor thereof, such proposed amendment or amendments shall be entered on their respective Journals with the yeas and nays thereon.

"The secretary of the state shall cause any such amendment or amendments to be published in at least one newspaper in every county of the state, where a newspaper is published once a week, for four consecutive weeks, in English and Spanish when newspapers in both of said languages are published in such counties, the last publication to be not more than two weeks prior to the election at which time said amendment or amendments shall be submitted to the electors of the state for their approval or rejection; and the said amendment or amendments shall be voted upon at the next regular election held in said state after the adjournment of the legislature proposing such amendment or amendments, or at such special election to be held not less than six months after the adjournment of said legislature, at such time as such legislature may by law provide. If the same be ratified by a majority of the electors voting thereon such amendment or amendments shall become part of this constitution. If two or more amendments are proposed, they shall be so submitted as to enable the electors to vote on each of them separately: Provided, that no amendment shall apply to or effect the provisions of sections one and three of article VII hereof, on elective franchise, and sections eight and ten of article XII hereof, on education, unless it be proposed by a vote

of three fourths of the members elected to each house and be ratified by a vote of the people of this state in an election at which at least three fourths of the electors voting in the whole state and at least two thirds of those voting in each county in the state shall vote for such amendment.

"Section 2. Whenever, during the first twenty-five years after the adoption of this constitution, the legislature, by a three-fourths vote of the members elected to each house, or, after the expiration of said period of twenty five years, by a two thirds vote of the members elected to each house, shall deem it necessary to call a convention to revise or amend this constitution, they shall submit the question of calling such convention to the electors at the next general election, and if a majority of all the electors voting on such question at said election in the state shall vote in favor of calling a convention the legislature shall, at the next session, provide by law for calling the same. Such convention shall consist of at least as many delegates as there are members of the house of representatives. The constitution adopted by such convention shall have no validity until it has been submitted to and ratified by the people.

"Section 3. If this constitution be in any way so amended as to allow laws to be enacted by direct vote of the electors the laws which may be so enacted shall be only such as might be enacted by the legislature under the provisions of this constitution.

"Section 4. When the United States shall consent thereto, the legislature, by a majority vote of the members of each house, may submit to the people the question of amending any provision of article XXI of this constitution on compact with the United States to the extent allowed by the act of congress permitting the same, and if a majority of the qualified electors who vote upon any such amendment shall vote in favor thereof the said article shall be thereby amended accordingly.

"Section 5. The provisions of section one of this article shall not be changed, altered, or abrogated in any manner except through a general convention called to revise this constitution as herein provided."






We, the Governor, Chief Justice and Secretary of New Mexico, acting as a board of canvassers under the provisions of section 5 of the public resolution of Congress entitled "Joint Resolution To admit the Territories of New Mexico and Arizona as states into the Union upon an equal footing with the original States, " which was approved August 21, 1911, do hereby declare that we assembled at the city of Santa Fe on the twenty-seventh day of November, 1911, that day being the third Monday after the holding of the first general state election of New Mexico on the seventh day of November, 1911, at which time, in accordance with the requirement of section 3 of said resolution of Congress, the electors of New Mexico voted upon a proposed amendment of their state constitution, which amendment is set forth at length in said resolution of Congress, and proceeded to canvass the returns of said election upon said amendment, and as a result of such canvass we find that of the legal votes cast at said election upon said amendment there were 34,897 votes in favor thereof, and 22,831 votes against said amendment, and we therefore certify said result to the Governor of the Territory of New Mexico as required by said resolution of Congress.

A statement in detail of the vote on said amendment is hereto attached, showing the vote thereon in each precinct, and also a recapitulation by counties.
